

5/1/24

24-23554: Recovered MV / Edison PD – Edison PD recovered the stolen Volvo XC90 from 1310 Vincenzo Dr. The owner was contacted and will be responding to recover it. OCSD CSI was notified and will be responding for processing.

DB: Person of Interest has been identified. Det. Mastronardy.

24-24159: Shots Fired / Jamestown Village – Units responded to the area for a report of possible shots fired. The single reporting person advised hearing arguing followed by a "loud pop" in the area of the driveway with the flag pole. While arriving, Patrol observes a white Kia Forte parked in the shoulder of Old Freehold. The driver, advised she was coming from Jamestown Vlg but could not specify where. She was subsequently arrested on an active warrant out of Lakewood...

At TRMJ, Bass was allowed to make a FaceTime audio call, during which time Booking Officer overheard a male state he had been shot at. Bass is Mirandized and is essentially uncooperative; refusing to provide any information regarding who she was with, where they reside, or what she witnessed. She did state she met up with a male friend in the Jamestown area for a brief period.

A canvas of the buildings along the cut through driveway where the flag pole was conducted by officers. The only resident who overheard anything was the original caller.

All Ocean and Monmouth County hospitals were notified of the incident. As of this time, no GSW victims have arrived. See officer safety email and report for further.

DB: The incident is being investigated by Det. MacRae.

5/3/24

24-24596 (Poss. Of Weapon/Poss. of Burglar Tools/Warrant) Brentwood & Whitesville Rd: While on proactive patrol in Tallymawr, Sergeant observed a male subject on the front lawn of a residence with a baseball bat in his hand, a mask on and latex gloves on his hands. He was immediately detained and a search of his person turned up a Swiss Tech emergency tool with a window breaker. The male party claimed he was making TikToks at 4 in the morning and also failed to initially provide his name and information so he was transported to District 1 as John Doe. Investigation revealed he was 20-year-old from Lakewood with a history of theft and other offenses. A black pick-up truck was observed in the area where he was located but no further details are known at this point. Our complaint was put on a summons but he was sent to OCJ on an NCIC warrant out of Cumberland County, PA for possession of a stolen vehicle and eluding charge that they are going to extradite for.

5/4/24

24-24849: Attempted Burglary/Crim Mischief, 1971 Church Rd: An unknown party attempted to gain entry to the residence via two garage windows that were damaged but not accessed. It was also reported that a previous report of burglary (24-24216) yielded additional proceeds, as a power washer and bag of tools were also missing. A supp was done to update that case.

DB: The incident is being investigated by Det. Carey.

5/6/24

24-25130: Burglary to MV / 552 Bash Rd – Victim was leaving for work when he discovered the front passenger side door and trunk to his vehicle open. Upon further invest it was discovered \$500 in cash, \$900 in Air Jordans, and numerous electronics were stolen overnight. A canvas revealed no cameras in the area.

24-26732: Shots Fired/Attempted Murder; 89 Camino Hermosa- Victim was riding his bicycle and was observed by suspect who pulled out a firearm and fired up to 14 rounds at victim. Victim was unharmed, but multiple houses were hit by missed rounds. DB and CSI assisted. Suspect entered wanted, interviews being conducted. Attempted Murder charge approved by AP. DB has lead on investigation.

DB: Attempted murder and multiple weapon charges were approved for two suspects, one being a juvenile. Multiple search warrants were executed. The investigation was lead by Det. Mastronardy.

Crime Summary

24-28734: Disorderly/Simple Assault; 1201 Hooper Ave (PF Changs)- Multiple Pagans were at restaurant and got into a fight with male from Lost Kings Motorcycle Gang. He was hit with a small bat like object which was captured on video (see file) but refused to cooperate with investigation. He was transported to CMC by Silverton EMS. Active investigation for proper identification of actors.

DB: The incident was looked into by Det. MacRae. Victim does not want any police involvement. Intel was passed along to OCPO.

5/25/24

24-28855: Attempted Burglary, 112 Fifth Avenue: At some point during the past two weeks, an unknown suspect removed a screen from a window and partially removed the mesh screen from another at the residence. No entry was made and there are no surveillance cameras.

24-29013/24-29116: Abandoned Boat, Ortley Beach – 76 year old male was piloting his 25' boat in the Atlantic Ocean with hopes of making it to Florida. After missing his turn for the Manasquan inlet he got lost in the fog and beached his vessel in Ortley. He has no insurance and no means to pay Sea Tow. USCG contacted and said they don't assist with salvage. Boat has now capsized on the shore. OEM/DPW/Accurate activated to remove and clean up and DEP notified.

24-29206: Home Invasion/ Burglary, 1443 Oakwood Hollow Ln: Same suspects from 1361 Vincenzo Dr (24-29103) entered the residence from an unlocked garage window. The suspects are observed on camera with face coverings, gloves and hoods up rummaging throughout the house looking for keys to homeowners 2024 Range Rover. The suspects were unable to locate and car keys and left with \$15 from a kitchen drawer. CSI was unable to respond, scene was processed by ET.

24-29932 ESU K9 Assist / 907 Dover Chase Blvd: ESU along with K9 assisted Manchester PD with a narcotics investigation. Once the scene was secured it was turned over to Manchester PD NET.

DDACTS for the month of May consisted of high visibility patrols and traffic education / enforcement on the East end of Route 37. We continue to receive complaints of vehicles racing and speeding on the highway.

May was also the Division of Highway Traffic Safety Click it or Ticket campaign; focus on education / enforcement when possible. Click it or ticket palm cards were placed in the lineup room.

Continued to conduct high visibility patrols in the neighborhoods and car dealerships in respective posts throughout shifts and documented any suspicious persons and activity. There were 3 vehicle thefts last month (2 residential, 1 dealership).
